

Our long-standing collaboration with the UCLA Film and Television Archive continued. culminating in the annual Celebration of Iranian Cinema, held from April 29 through May 14, 2023, at the Hammer Museum. A standout moment from this year's series was the premiere of The Voice of Dust and Ash, a documentary about the life and legacy of Maestro Mohammad **Reza Shaiarian.** Directed by first-time filmmaker Mandana Biscotti, the film was a moving tribute to one of Iran's most beloved figures. Moreover, the series presented a diverse selection of works by Iranian filmmakers, and we were proud to support the screening of short films that highlighted the #WomanLifeFreedom movement, curated by Dr. Roya Razstegar. In view of the fact that our award ceremony for The Farhang Short Film Festival was canceled in 2022, we had a special presentation to honor the top three winners of the competition



In a new partnership, Farhana Foundation was thrilled to collaborate with the South Coast Repertory theater company for the world premiere of avaaz, written and performed by Michael Shayan, from April 29 to May 27, 2023. The program concluded with a reception featuring music by DJ Omid Walizadeh and delightful Iranian cuisine by Chef Mojdeh Eghbal.

POETS, LOCKS, CAGES

Vancouver Artgallery

Art Opens pathways to our future



From July 1 to November 19, 2023, Farhang Foundation proudly partnered with Canada's renowned **Vancouver Art Gallery** to present **Parviz Tanavoli: Poets, Locks, Cages**, a landmark exhibition curated by Vancouver-based independent curator **Pantea Haghighi**. This exhibition marked the first major Canadian presentation of works by internationally acclaimed Iranian-born, Vancouver-based artist Parviz Tanavoli. This partnership was also the first ever international project for Farhang Foundation.

Tanavoli, celebrated for his unique synthesis of sculpture and poetry, captivated audiences with over one hundred works spanning six decades of his career. **Poets, Locks, Cages** offered a deep exploration of recurring themes in Tanavoli's work—the poet, the lock, and the cage—revealing the rich symbolism and profound meaning behind each. The exhibition highlighted Tanavoli's expertise in sculpture while showcasing his mastery across painting, printmaking, and mixed media. A pivotal member of the Saqqakhaneh school, Tanavoli draws inspiration from Iran's cultural heritage. Born in Tehran in 1937, he graduated from Milan's Brera Academy in 1959 and went on to teach sculpture at institutions such as the Tehran College of Decorative Arts, the Minneapolis College of Art and Design, and the University of Tehran, where he chaired the sculpture department for eighteen years. Since 1989 Tanavoli has divided his time between Tehran and Vancouver, contributing significantly to the international art scene.

The exhibition also featured Tanavoli's works from prestigious institutions, including the British Museum in London, the Grey Art Gallery at New York University, the Tehran Museum of Contemporary Art, the Metropolitan Museum in New York, and Tate Modern in London, underscoring his global impact and the enduring relevance of his art.





















Farhang Foundation proudly supported Iranian composers and performers at the 77th Ojai Music Festival, held June 8–11, 2023, at the scenic Ojai Libbey Bowl. This year's festival celebrated an extraordinary lineup of Iranian talent, including the renowned Kayhan Kalhor, alongside Nina Barzegar, Golfam Khayam, Nasim Khorassani, Niloufar Nourbakhsh, Aida Shirazi, and Niloufar Shiri. Known for presenting groundbreaking musical experiences, the Ojai Music Festival welcomed Grammy- and Pulitzer Prize-winning artist Rhiannon Giddens as its 2023 musical director, crafting a uniquely memorable edition that spotlighted diverse voices and cultures in an unforgettable setting.

This four-day event showcased an international array of artists, highlighting the talents of renowned kamancheh player Kayhan Kalhor and compositions by members of the Iranian Female Composers Association (IFCA). Notably, Aida Shirazi's piece was featured in the "Ojai Dawns" concert on Friday, Nasim Khorassani and Nina Barzegar had their works presented in the "Vis-à-Vis" concert on Friday, and Niloufar Nourbakhsh's composition was showcased in "The Willows Are New" concert on Saturday.

Kayhan Kalhor performed in four concerts throughout the festival, including the Thursday opening night concert, "The Willows Are New" concert, and both Sunday concerts at the Libbey Bowl. The event, organized in partnership with the Ojai Music Festival and the Iranian Female Composers Association, was a testament to the rich cultural heritage and artistic excellence of Iranian musicians and composers.







The **New West Symphony** proudly presented the extraordinary **Hamed Nikpay** at the inaugural New West Summerfest, held at Moorpark College. This open-air, two-day music festival showcased Grammy-winning and Billboard-charting artists from a variety of genres, including Jazz, Country, Classic Rock, Mariachi, and Iranian music, creating an exceptional cross-cultural musical experience.

Hamed Nikpay, renowned for his unique fusion of classical Iranian melodies with contemporary sounds, captivated audiences with his distinctive style, which he calls "Sufi Funk." As a fusion vocalist, multi-instrumentalist, and songwriter, Nikpay delivered soulful harmonies and innovative compositions, immersing listeners in a fresh blend of Iranian tradition and modernity.

Farhang Foundation, in collaboration with UCLA's Herb was the powerful voice of award-winning vocalist Azam Ali. Alpert School of Music, proudly presented Niyaz: The Fourth Through an artful blend of sound, space, image, and light, Light, An Immersive Multimedia Experience at Royce Hall. Following its international success, this critically acclaimed interdisciplinary show by the renowned electroacoustic music group Niyaz made an unforgettable Los Angeles debut.

The Fourth Light was inspired by the life and philosophy of composer Loga Ramin Torkian, Niyaz seamlessly fuses Rabia al Basri, the first female Sufi poet and mystic, and took audiences on a breathtaking journey into the soul. The production combined live music and dance with cutting- Degrees Records, Niyaz has garnered global acclaim edge interactive technologies, including advanced projection and body-mapping that responded to sound and movement in real time, creating a visually and emotionally immersive experience.

At the heart of this multisensory performance

the audience was invited into a transformative experience, breaking boundaries between the art and the observer.

Rahill

The Getty Center presented two remarkable events as part of the Getty—Off the 405 series, showcasing their commitment to Iranian art and culture through dynamic public performances. The first event, held on July 29, 2023, featured a free concert by Rahill at the Getty Center in Los Angeles. The evening opened with a DJ set by KCRW's Nassir Nassirzadeh, setting the stage for Rahill's headlining performance. A multidisciplinary artist and musician from Michigan, now based in New York's Hudson Valley, Rahill is best known as a founding member of Brooklyn's garage-rock band Habibi. Her solo work reflects her Iranian American heritage, deepened by frequent visits to Iran. Rahill's debut LP, Flowers at Your Feet, pays homage to her familial roots in Shiraz and Isfahan, charting her evolution as a singer-songwriter. The album's first single, "Fables," is a vibrant, genre-blending pop track produced by art-pop icon Beck, showcasing her distinctively contemplative and radiant style.





DJ Maral

On September 17, 2023, the series continued with a performance by **DJ Maral** at the Getty Center. This event brought together three artists exploring themes of nature, life cycles, and cultural intersections. JJJJJerome Ellis presented a unique, site-specific blend of poetry and music in the Central Garden, while Kerry Tribe premiered "The Complaint," a new performance piece. Maral closed the event with an electrifying set on the Garden Terrace Stage, blending Iranian classical and folk samples with experimental electronic genres like noise, punk/post-punk, and dub. AT THE SAN DIEGO MUSEUM OF ART

Farhang Foundation, in partnership with the **San Diego Museum of Art**, presented two compelling programs featuring Iranian artist **Mohammad Barrangi**. The first, **Dreamscapes: Mohammad Barrangi**, took place on September 15, 2023, as part of Farhang Foundation's virtual events series. This enlightening program featured a conversation with UK-based Iranian artist Mohammad Barrangi, moderated by **Dr. Ladan Akbarnia** and Farhang's own **Roshi Rahnama**, offering audiences a glimpse into his layered artistic practice and unique perspective.

From October 4 to October 6, 2023, Farhang Foundation and the San Diego Museum of Art presented **Mohammad Barrangi: A Live Art Installation**. Held daily at the Colonnade entrance to the May S. Marcy Sculpture Court, this free, in-person event provided visitors with an exclusive opportunity to engage directly with Barrangi's creative process. During the installation, Barrangi demonstrated his signature reverse print transfer technique, allowing attendees to observe the meticulous steps involved in producing his large-scale works. For this special installation, Barrangi crafted a diptych inspired by Iranian history and visual traditions, providing a close-up view of the intricacies behind his art.

This immersive experience deepened visitors' understanding of Barrangi's art and techniques, such as those used in *Migration* (2018), a work acquired by the San Diego Museum of Art in 2021. The live installation enriched appreciation for contemporary Iranian art and highlighted Barrangi's innovative contributions to the field.

A contemporary Iranian artist, Barrangi combines modern printmaking techniques with the traditional aesthetics of Iranian illustrated manuscripts. His work, which explores personal identity and the universal themes of diaspora, often reflects his experiences as an immigrant in a globalized world. Barrangi's distinctive style blends Persian calligraphy, storytelling, and experimental mark-making, resulting in both intimate works on handmade paper and expansive murals. Born in Rasht, Iran, in 1988, Barrangi overcame the challenges of limited mobility in his left arm, creating his works with his right hand and both feet. His art—infused with Persian calligraphy, textual elements, and touches of humor—celebrates resilience and the adaptability of the human spirit.

FROM PERSIA TO IRAN:

A Modern Story

A LECTURE BY PROFESSOR

DR. ALI MIRSEPASSI

Farhang Foundation, in partnership with USC Dornsife's Iranian Studies Degree Program, proudly presented From Persia to Iran: A Modern Story, a lecture by New York University Professor Ali Mirsepassi, as part of the USC Distinguished Lecture Series. Held at USC's Doheny Memorial Library, this free, in-person event provided valuable insights into a pivotal moment in Iranian history.

In December 1934 the Iranian government requested that foreign missions in Tehran replace the name "Persia" with "Iran." Professor Mirsepassi's lecture delved into the political intentions and cultural ramifications of this change, challenging the conventional view that it was merely a reflection of Reza Shah's admiration for Nazi Germany's nationalist ideologies. Instead, he presented a nuanced interpretation, arguing that the decision stemmed from an intellectual movement among Iranian nationalists during the interwar period to rediscover a cosmopolitan "idea of Iran." This intellectual pursuit was deeply influenced by the transnational experiences of Iranian émigrés, activists, and scholars who engaged with Weimar Berlin in the 1920s and continued their work upon returning to Iran in the mid-1930s.


Professor Ali Mirsepassi, the Albert Gallatin Research Excellence Professor of Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies at NYU, is widely recognized for his contributions to Iranian intellectual history, political Islam, and modernity. His lecture offered attendees a deeper understanding of the complex historical forces that shaped Iran's identity in the modern era.


Without Her, directed by Arian Vazirdaftari, captivated audiences at its October 18 screening at Triangle 4 Theatres in Costa Mesa. Starring Tannaz Tabatabaei, Saber Abar, and Shadi Karamroudi, the film presents a haunting narrative around Roya, who, just two weeks before emigrating from Iran to Denmark, encounters a quiet, lost young woman. Taking her in, Roya introduces the girl to her husband, family, and friends, unaware that this stranger harbors a mysterious intent to take her place.







The following night, A Revolution on Canvas, directed by Sara Nodjoumi and codirected by her husband, Till **Schauder**, premiered at Regal Edwards Big Newport. This hybrid political thriller and verité-style documentary stars Nahid Hagigat and Nickzad Nodjoumi, delving into the enigmatic disappearance of over one hundred "treasonous" paintings by Nodjoumi, a leading figure in Iranian contemporary art. Through an in-depth exploration of these lost works, the film marks a powerful directorial debut for Sara Nodjoumi, offering audiences a fascinating journey into art, mystery, and political history.



Iranian Films at the 2023

In October 2023, Farhang Foundation proudly partnered with the prestigious **American Film Institute** for the ninth consecutive year to present the Iranian film lineup at the **2023 AFI FEST**, underscoring its dedication to promoting Iranian cinema and providing a global platform for Iranian filmmakers to share their narratives.

On October 26, 2023, the festival screened **Terrestrial Verses**, directed by **Ali Asgari** and **Alireza Khatami**. This powerful film addressed the oppression and conformity imposed by the Iranian government through a series of thought-provoking vignettes. Asgari and Khatami used each segment to showcase the restrictive limitations placed on freedom of choice and expression, employing wry humor to highlight the absurdity of these constraints. In a symbolic choice, the filmmakers kept those in power offscreen, while confining powerless individuals within the frame, effectively illustrating the lack of freedom felt by everyday Iranians. *Terrestrial Verses* featured a talented cast, including, **Sadaf Asgari**, **Gohar Kheirandish**, **Bahram Ark**, **Arghavan Shabani**, and **Servin Zabetian**, who brought depth and authenticity to this impactful story.

On October 28, 2023, AFI FEST presented Shayda, directed by Noora Niasari, followed by an engaging conversation with the director. Shayda, Australia's official Oscar® submission for Best International Feature, marked Niasari's remarkable debut and was executive produced by Academy Award® winner Cate Blanchett. Set in the mid-1990s, the film follows Shayda, portrayed by Cannes Best Actress winner Zar Amir, as she seeks safety in an Australian women's shelter with her six-year-old daughter Mona after her husband Hossein's abusive behavior escalates. As Shayda files for divorce—a taboo act within her Iranian community—the film intimately explores her journey toward independence and resilience, highlighting the obstacles she faces, including Hossein's court-mandated visits with Mona. Shayda shines a light on female solidarity and the resilience of motherhood, with supporting roles showcasing the strength of the women in the shelter. Winner of the World Cinema Audience Award at Sundance, the film boasts a strong cast, including Osamah Sami, Mojean Aria, Jillian Nguyen, and Rina Mousavi. Shayda was produced by Vincent Sheehan and Noora Niasari, with executive producers Cate Blanchett, Andrew Upton, Coco Francini, Caitlin Gold, and Lindsay Lanzillotta.

A REVOLUTION ON CANVAS

Exclusive Los Angeles Premiere

Farhang Foundation and HBO Documentary Films proudly presented the exclusive Los Angeles premiere of A Revolution on Canvas, directed by Sara Nodjoumi and Till Schauder, at the Laemmle Royal Theatre. Following the screening, an in-person Q&A session took place with Nickzad Nodjoumi, Sara Nodjoumi, Till Schauder, and Sussan Deyhim, moderated by Houman Sarshar, offering the audience a unique opportunity to engage with the creators behind the film.

A Revolution on Canvas is a captivating hybrid of political thriller and verité-style documentary. In her directorial debut alongside her husband and codirector, Till Schauder, Sara Nodjoumi unravels the mystery surrounding the disappearance of more than one hundred "treasonous" paintings by her father, renowned Iranian modern artist Nickzad Nodjoumi. Born in Kermanshah, Iran, in 1942, Nickzad Nodjoumi studied art at Tehran University of Fine Arts and later earned a master's degree from the City College of New York. Upon returning to Tehran, he joined the faculty of his alma mater and became politically active, creating revolutionary posters that openly criticized the Shah's regime. After his exile following the revolution, Nodjoumi continued to express his political stance through his art, using figurative painting laced with satire and cultural motifs to comment on sociopolitical issues.

Sara Nodjoumi brings a global lens to her work, focusing on perspectives often overlooked by Western media. Her producing credits include When God Sleeps, a widely acclaimed documentary that played at over one hundred festivals worldwide and was shortlisted for the 2018 German Academy Award. Codirector and cinematographer Till Schauder is known for his work on The Iran Job as well as When God Sleeps, both shortlisted for German Academy Awards, and has directed multiple award-winning documentaries. Together, they present a profound exploration of art, exile, and political identity in A Revolution on Canvas.
















DINING WITH THE SULTAN:


FALLING INTO LANGUAGE

Farhang Foundation and **Sony Pictures Classics** hosted the exclusive Los Angeles premiere of **Shayda** at Lumiere Cinema at the Music Hall. This special screening included an engaging Q&A session with lead actress **Zar Amir** and director **Noora Niasari**, moderated by actress and activist **Sara Seyed**.

Shayda, inspired by true events, is the work of Tehran-born, Australia-raised writer, director, and producer Noora Niasari. The film stars Zar Amir, Cannes Best Actress Winner for Holy Spider, and is executive produced by Academy Award® winner Cate Blanchett. Shayda premiered at the 2023 Sundance Film Festival in the World Dramatic Competition, where it won the Audience Award, and was selected for several prestigious festivals, including the 48th Toronto International Film Festival, 76th Locarno Film Festival, 28th Busan International Film Festival, 67th BFI London Film Festival, 37th AFI Fest, and 71st Melbourne International Film Festival. It also received the Young Talent Award at the 31st Filmfest Hamburg and won CinefestOZ, Australia's most lucrative film prize.

Selected as Australia's official submission for Best International Feature Film at the 96th Academy Awards, *Shayda* has earned Niasari significant acclaim. Following her win for Best Direction in a Feature Film at the 2023 Australian Directors' Guild (ADG) Awards, she received a nomination for the Michael Apted Award for Outstanding Directorial Achievement in a First-Time Theatrical Feature Film at the 76th Directors Guild of America (DGA) Awards.

The film centers on Shayda, a courageous Iranian mother who finds refuge in an Australian women's shelter with her six-year-old daughter. During the Iranian New Year, they find comfort in Nowruz rituals and the hope of new beginnings. However, Shayda's newfound stability is threatened when her estranged husband reappears, challenging her hard-won path to freedom.

This virtual event brought to life the story of **Barbad in Khosrow Parviz's Nowruz Celebration** through Gordafarid's powerful narration, enhanced by the artful cinematography of **Arash Rad**. Since 1998 Gordafarid has excelled in performing the traditional art of Persian storytelling, or Naqqali, dedicating herself to preserving and revitalizing this ancient form. She has traveled throughout Iran to collect stories, following in the footsteps of Naqqali masters and challenging social norms that once restricted this art form to men in public venues. Her groundbreaking achievements earned her recognition from Morshed Torabi, Iran's most renowned Naqqal, who honored her by bestowing upon her his cane.



His forthcoming works include studies on the solar calendar and Iranian identity, historiography and reconstruction of national identity in Iran, and a biography of Fatemah Zarin-Taj Baraghani Qorrat al-Ayn Tahereh.

> Professor Amanat has edited or coedited thirteen volumes and published numerous articles, encyclopedia entries, and opinion pieces. He served as the Chair of the Yale Council on Middle East Studies and the Director of the Yale Program in Iranian Studies.
